Hello from Cedarvale Orchids

Welcome to the 2010 Cedarvale Orchids Catalogue.

You probably were wondering if we were still around seeing that we have not put out a new catalogue since 2008 but here we are – late again! But better late than never.

Again we have had mixed fortunes since our last catalogue with long periods of dry followed by some wonderful periods of rain and high humidity and finishing with the last growing season being the best that I can remember for many, many years. (But I'm getting older and more forgetful as the years go by and maybe that remark carries no weight.) The nursery currently looks so good that I'm worried that some major catastrophe must surely be around the corner. Never have we grown the *Den speciosum* plants so well – they are ready to burst. What this will mean for the next flowering on such massive canes I can hardly wait to see.

Last season's flowering was incredible with all plants carrying masses of spikes – I have never seen so many canes with 3 and 4 spikes per cane. The nursery was a picture. But of course you can not have everything and a lot of the flowers were as 'big as mouses' ears'. But we still managed to hold our own at the spring shows. We flowered some superb quality *speciosum* seedlings of our own breeding and one or two wonderful hybrids. I am far from disappointed with the direction that our breeding is taking.

Again I have to comment on the contribution that considerable attention to maintaining the correct Ph in the potting medium makes to good orchid culture. I use a high percentage of treated pine bark in our medium and being an organic product it is subject to natural deterioration and acidic Ph adjustment which I consider a major problem for long term good growth. But let me get off that hobby horse and talk about orchids.

I had difficulties with setting pods and getting viable seed for this year's catalogue and hence you note that our new lists are very small for the *Dendrocoryne* hybrids and species, and *Sarchochilus*. I had much better success with the hard cane *Dendrobiums* including *Den bigibbum*. (I think I made 300+ pollinations to achieve this year's limited new listings) But 2009 was the complete opposite and almost every cross that I made resulted in viable seed. So if all goes well (and I am still vertical) we should see a host a new and interesting plants on our list. We still continue to liaise closely with our good friends at Down Under Native Orchids, Green Vista Orchids, Triple M & D Orchids, Bevan Burnham and Brian Richards to collectively make available the highest quality hybrids and species to you.

You will note that I still have not gotten over that urge to breed *Den speciosums* given that I have not fully utilised the wonderful material available today combined with the new flowering seedlings, but Rhonda is working on me to get that urge out of my system. You will also note that we have included some *Tolumnia* seedlings on our catalogue for the first time. The latest crosses of these plants produce such colourful floral displays on small plants that are easy to grow, quick to flower and occupy so little space and we thought these should be more available to the orchid public.

Please remember that the pictures on the website Gallery page are mostly breeding plants and plants retained and **are only infrequently available by division**. These should be looked at mainly as being indicative of flowering of their progeny. We endeavour to update the catalogue listings on the website as often as possible - as you can appreciate quantities and sizes are always changing. For those customers who do not have internet access, in-house printed catalogues are readily available by forwarding us a stamped self-addressed envelope.

We continue to provide listings of divisions available to our customers. This usually happens in the earlier months of the year when the plants are ready to be repotted, have finished flowering and the new canes are strong.

We hope you enjoy this catalogue and look forward to catching up with you at one of the many shows we attend or at our Nursery. Don't forget if you are passing our patch drop in for a cuppa and a chat and I promise not to pester you to buy anything. But always ring before you come – you might get very unfriendly if you come all the way out to find no-one home and the gate locked.

	'Keith' seems to have very low morals and goes with anyone. This mating is with 'Steve' which is a strong 'in-your-face' bright yellow flower on medium sized spikes with good habit. Result should be colourful 'Elegant Heart' style quality flowers. Southern customers should note that these plants will require cover and dry conditions during winter months and may even need heat south of Sydney.		50mm**/80mm**
CV534/05	D. Peewee 'Keith' x D. (Ellen x Peter Hewitt)	HOT/COLD (25% bigibbum)	
	"Keith' again – the problem with being 'easy' is you get used a lot. The pod parent is a very large segmented white flower with red tip SOLD its and a deep purple lip. The expectation here is lots of predominantly purple large flower t spikes. Southern customers should note that these plants will require cover and dry conditions during winter months and may even need heat south of Sydney.		80mm***
CV559/05	D. (Tie-Dye x June Mac) '#1' x D. speciosum var (speciosum x curvicaule) 'Samford Moon'	HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	
	A remake of earlier crosses but this time using 'Samford Moon', an intervarietal cross between 'National White' and 'Daylight Moon' which produces long sprays of beautifully presented exceptionally shaped flowers. Combined this time with the fluorescent stripes and lip on the pod parent to possibly produce brighter flowers on increased flower counts.		50mm
CV564/05	D. (Tie-Dye x June Mac) '#1' x D. speciosum var curvicaule 'Jacqueline'	HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	
	Similar cross to CV559/05 but using a pollen parent with larger heavier-segmented flowers than 'Samford Moon'. Should be interesting to see which of these crosses produces the best result. Why not buy one of each?		50mm
CV569/05	D. Peewee 'Keith' x D. speciosum var grandiflorum 'Jelita' = D. Elegant Heart	HOT/COLD (25% bigibbum)	
	'Jelita' is an exceptional orchid that should produce exceptional offspring so what else would you do but put it with poor old 'Keith' and stand back and watch the colour flow. The potential here is for pure gold 'Elegant Heart' flowers. Southern customers should note that these plants will require cover and dry conditions during winter months and may even need heat south of Sydney.		50mm
CV571/05	D. Inquest 'Tom Richards' x D. speciosum var (speciosum x curvicaule) 'Samford Moon'	HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	
	The pod parent has strong upright spikes of large chunky predominantly purple-edged flowers with strong purple lips producing a veritable SOLD r. As stated previously 'Samford Moon' is an intervarietal cross between 'National White' and 'Daylight Moon' which produces long sprays of beautifully presented exceptionally shaped flowers. CV572/05	D. Inquest 'Bender' x D. speciosum var (speciosum x curvicaule) 'Samford Moon'	HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)

CV599/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var <i>capricornicum</i> 'Big Boy' x 'Autumn Snow' One for the purists – ‘Big Boy’ has the largest flower that I have seen on a variety <i>capricornicum</i> and ‘Autumn Show’ is not far behind it. Flowers should be well out of the foliage, white and beautifully presented. The pollen flowers came courtesy of Bevan Burnham who considers this plant to be one of his best variety <i>capricornicum</i> .	50mm/80mm
CV602/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i>'National White' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #4') ‘National White’ has that great spike habit of almost vertical spikes with beautifully presented white flowers. ‘Dave’s Moon’ is a light lemon very good variety <i>curvicaule</i> from the ‘Daylight Moon’ lineage. Outcome should be cream to yellow of meaty flowers on medium sized arching sprays.	50mm***
CV603/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'Little John' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #4') ‘Little John’ is a more robust plant than ‘National White’ with larger more heavily-segmented flowers. Outcome should be similar to the previous cross with potentially larger flowers with heavier segments. Why not buy one of each and compare the results.	50mm
CV604/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Dreamtime' x 'National White' Another for the purists – ‘Dreamtime’ has the largest flowers on a variety <i>speciosum</i> that I have seen matched with a strong upright spike of well-presented flowers should produce large white flowers on strong upright spikes. Should be a must for the type form collector.	50mm***
CV605/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var (<i>capricornicum</i> 'Black Gold' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #4') This time ‘Dave’s Moon’ has been put onto a brilliant gold, medium-sized variety <i>capricornicum</i> with a view to producing progeny with the variety <i>curvicaule</i> attributes enhanced by the brilliant gold of ‘Black Gold’ on compact robust plants. Let’s hope it works!	50mm***
CV607/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var <i>grandiflorum</i> 'Rhonda's Gold' x ('Gallangowan' x 'Kroombit Gold') Both of these parents are outstanding gold variety <i>grandiflorum</i> and if we produce something better than either, they will be exceptional. Unfortunately we will have to wait quite a while before we see these exceptional seedlings flower. So purchasers will need to set lots of space aside.	50mm***
CV608/06	<i>D speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> '733/91' x ('Tony's #1' x 'Misty Mtn') This cross was made by our friend Bevan Burnham from Alstonville who is rapped in the pod parent which has won a number of categories for him at various shows. He also believes the pollen parent will develop into one of his better variety <i>curvicaule</i> . In Bevan’s words “they should be good!”	50mm**
CV649/07	<i>D speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Dorothy' x 'Stewart' Two strong growing robust type plants mated here. Dorothy with large cream flowers and Stewart with even larger crystal white flowers. No matter which one dominates the result should be worth having.	50mm
CV650/07	<i>D speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'Dorothy' x <i>grandiflorum</i> 'Mt Larcom Gold') The expectation here is to produce long sprays of large golden flowers with broad segments and good presentation. Time will tell!	50mm
CV651/07	<i>D speciosum</i> var (<i>grandiflorum</i> 'Mt Larcom Gold' x <i>speciosum</i> 'Dorothy') Similar expectations to CV650/07 but it will be interesting to see if that old theory that the pod plant has a stronger influence on the progeny by comparing the two.	50mm

Should produce strong squat plants that will only need lots of space when they flower.	80mm***/125mm***
CV307/02	<i>D. kingianum</i> ('Cup Cake' x 'Harrigan') x <i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' = <i>D. x delicatum</i> 'Windermere' is reputed not to bloom in its progeny and 'Cup Cake' x 'Harrigan' is a large flowered red kingianum – thus looking for genuine red 'delis'.	80mm**/125mm**
CV433/03	<i>D. kingianum</i> ('Cup Cake' x 'Harrigan') '#1' x <i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'National White' = <i>D x delicatum</i> Another attempt to produce red dellies. The <i>kingianum</i> used has large deep purple flowers on upright spikes and should be dominant. 'National White' normally produces bench quality flowers with strong upright spikes and high flower counts. No reason for it not to do the same again.	80mm**
CV442/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Rip Snorter' x 'Windermere' One for the purist grower. A type for yellow flowers. Should be some bench quality robust squat plants that both produce shapely plants amongst these.	150mm**
CV443/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'Little John' HCC/AOC x <i>pedunculatum</i> 'Atherton') Looking for top quality show bench which great shape and texture well above the foliage on strong upright spikes. Plants should be compact and very robust	100mm**/150mm**
CV446/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>grandiflorum</i> 'Mt Larcom Gold' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Kabi 2003') If all goes according to plan these plants should have large yellow/gold flowers with added texture and shape on long spikes and height. Another good point is the plants should remain compact and tidy. What more could you ask for?	100mm**/150mm***

CV450/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>hillii</i> x sibling	I thought that at least once I should breed some variety <i>hillii</i> seedlings seeing that this variety is very much overlooked for show benches - the judges don't look favourably upon them. But when you get a good one (like the parent plant) the number of flowers that they can produce is incredible, known to stop any hardened judge in their tracks.	125mm
CV453/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>grandiflorum</i> 'Jelita' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Bevan's Pride' HCC/ANOS)	This cross also made by Bevan. 'Jelita' is his truly beautiful variety <i>grandiflorum</i> which was praised in an early Bill Murdoch award judging. 'Bevan's Pride' is a superb variety <i>curvicaule</i> with all the great attributes of texture, flower count and perfect presentation, in Bevan's words "Gee! I think it's a pretty good orchid". There should be some award quality plants amongst these seedlings.	150mm
CV458/04	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' x <i>grandiflorum</i> 'Fool's Gold')	Another reverse cross this time of CV456/04 on previous listings to see if this way produces better results. The plants should be more compact at least.	150mm
CV500/04	<i>D. Rudkin</i> '#2' x <i>D.</i> (Yondi x Hazel) 'Biggest'	A mating of two medium sized and beautifully shaped colourful flowers which should produce clouds of flowers in almost any hue. Should be very attractive.	80mm***
CV523/05	<i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Kate's Special' x 'Alabaster'	One for the purists – two superb variety <i>speciosum</i> plants. The pod parent produces large heavy-textured white flowers on upright spikes while 'Alabaster' carries long sprays of clean white flowers with exceptionally good presentation. A combination of the good aspects of these two plants should be worth the wait.	50mm/100mm/125mm
CV537/05	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'Bevan' x <i>capricornicum</i> 'Big Boy' HCC/AOC)	'Bevan' is a strong growing variety <i>speciosum</i> with an incredible display of cream well-presented shapely flowers. 'Big Boy' has the largest flower I have ever seen on a variety <i>capricornicum</i> with great shape and presentation. Looking for compact stout plants with clouds of quality flowers above the foliage.	50mm***/100mm/125mm
CV538/05	<i>D. speciosum</i> var (<i>grandiflorum</i> 'Jelita' x <i>capricornicum</i> 'Big Boy' HCC/AOC)	This cross should be similar to CV537/05 but looking for the flowers to be large and gold.	50mm***/100mm/ /125mm
CV540/05	<i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Alabaster' x 'Kate's Special'	This is the reverse cross of CV523/05 and it could be interesting to see if the role reversal of the parents makes a difference.	50mm***/100mm/ 125mm/150mm
