Hello from Cedarvale Orchids

Welcome to the 2011-2012 Cedarvale Orchids Catalogue

Many of you have been enquiring about the whereabouts of our 2011 catalogue as our website still shows our 2010 catalogue to be the current listing. Well, the 2011 version has finally arrived and it is full of lots of interesting (mostly) Australasian native hybrids and species.

When we look back on fourteen years in the business of growing and selling orchids we are always amazed to see just how far we have come. It has been a continual learning curve for both of us as we push through the mire of deciding which crosses to make and which new hybrids will be pleasing to our customers. The quality of the parent plants available today not only to us but to all native breeders is so good that you can be almost assured that the plants you buy will be anywhere between good and brilliant for size, colour and floriferousness.

Looking back on the year that is so quickly passing it has been jam packed with lots of interesting events, many of which we can look forward to repeating in the new year. The Events Page for 2012 will be on our website in the new year and is a must for dates to mark on your calendar. You can visit us at various orchid shows in Queensland and New South Wales.

In our last catalogue we commented on the last growing season (2009) being the best we have seen for a long time. Well as you will all be aware the end of 2010 and the start of 2011 for Queensland resulted in large amounts of rain and we found the growth in the orchids simply continues. However all of that lovely growth only resulted in a moderate flowering with a number (more than usual) of specimen plants only producing one or two spikes and some none at all. Not such a great year for flowering however we will be expecting better results from those fat juicy canes next year.

We still managed to flower some new seedlings with very few disappointments amongst them as well as still being competitive at the local shows. We are still satisfied with the direction that the breeding program is taking. You will notice however that the number of *Den speciosum* crosses has reduced and those listed have just had to be made given the availability that we now have to the top echelon of *Den speciosum* parents. The results will excite you!

I wonder if Ross will ever get over that urge for quality *Den speciosum* breeding?

Winter presented us with cold and dull weather which subsequently gave us a late flowering of the *Den speciosum* and quite a bit of leaf drop in the more tropical plants.

This year we have virtually sold out our stocks of *Den bigibbum* thanks to a few large landscaping contracts and have moved into the area of *Den Topaz Dream* crosses where we are expecting to produce many 'pots of colour'. *Den Topaz Dream* is a many flowered mini-bigibbum style cross between *Den Fantasyland* and *Den bigibbum* and is easy to grow and flower.

We have taken a commercial decision to discontinue stocking *Sarcochilus* species and hybrids given the difficulty to grow and flower these in South East Queensland and the consequent sales from this area. Orders also from our southern clients for these plants have been limited due we assume to the free availability of seedlings from southern nurseries. We thank all those customers who have purchased *Sarcochilus* plants from us in the past and hope that you are enjoying the growing and flowering of them still.

Once again this year our divisions listing of *Den speciosum* and Others was worth waiting for and very popular with many orchid enthusiasts. It will be available again early in the new year. On occasions we will do email marketing campaigns to communicate to our customers the availability of some specimen plants which we are prepared to release.

We feel that we need to remind you again of the importance of maintaining the correct Ph in the potting medium for good orchid culture and long term growth. Our growing seems to have improved dramatically since we paid serious attention to having the correct Ph.

We are both currently participants in the planning for the 7th Australasian Native Orchid Conference and Show being hosted by the ANOS Kabi Group in August 2013 at Strathpine near Brisbane. We have started organizing our plants to be at their prime for what we expect to be a spectacular event and trust you are doing the same. We look forward to seeing you and your plants there.

We hope you enjoy this catalogue and look forward to catching up with you at one of the many shows we attend or at our Nursery. Don't forget if you are passing our patch drop in for a cuppa and a chat and I promise not to pester you to buy anything. But always ring before you come – you might get very unfriendly if you come all the way out to find no-one home and the gate locked.

	The pod parent here is a heavily textured large burgundy flower well presented on medium sized spikes. Mated with a compact style <i>D speciosum</i> with medium sprays of yellow flowers of good size and texture.	
CV720/08	<i>D</i> Breathless 'King's Park' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	50mm/80mm
	Breathless is a large maroon coloured Awesome type flower mated here with the classic <i>D speciosum</i> 'Windermere' – should produce medium sized sprays of bench quality large flowers.	
CV723/08	<i>D</i> Elegant Heart 'Springtime' x Graeme Banks 'Chrissie' HOT/COLD (12% bigibbum)	50mm***
	'Springtime' is a very large autumn toned well presented flower with a rich pink lip and is mated here with large golden flowers with lots of <i>D speciosum</i> in the background. Looking for very large heavily textured flowers with a possibility of a strong autumn toning or bright yellow.	
CV724/08	<i>D</i> Peewee 'Keith' x Sunglow 'Big Yellow' = <i>D</i> Lustrous HOT/COLD (25% bigibbum)	50mm/80mm
	Peewee 'Keith' is one of our frequently used breeders which in the past has produced some remarkably good crosses. Used here with a heavily textured wide segmented Sunglow and looking to produce some of the brilliant maroon Lustrous plants used extensively in earlier breeding.	
CV725/08	<i>D</i> (Lustrous x Aussie Quest) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #2' HOT/COLD (6% bigibbum)	50mm/80mm
	The pod parent displays one of the strongest luminous purple flowers in our nursery. Combined here with a top quality floriferous var <i>curvicaule</i> with Daylight Moon in its parentage the results should be extremely colourful if not absolutely startling.	
CV726/08	<i>D</i> (Duno Burgundy Sheen x Yondi Tina = <i>D</i> Sheena) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (6% bigibbum)	50mm/80mm
	Same cross as CV719/08 but instead using the classic <i>D speciosum</i> 'Windermere' which is renowned for the superb progeny it has produced. Which of the two crosses is the best is too hard to tell... maybe you should buy some of each and find out for yourself.	
CV728/08	<i>D</i> (Stunning x <i>speciosum</i> = <i>D</i> Monroe) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #2' HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	50mm
	The pod parent was champion hybrid at the ANOS Kabi Spring Show 2008 and it is a large pale lemon flower with a red lip and red markings in the segments. The pollen parent is one of the classic Daylight Moon progeny which would hold its head up in any <i>D speciosum</i> judging. Look for medium to long sprays of heavily textured well presented show bench flowers.	
CV730/08	<i>D</i> Bergen x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>capricornicum</i> 'Big Boy' HOT/COLD(3% bigibbum)	50mm***
	The pod parent is a clear white flower with <i>D</i> Awesome as one of its parents and as such is a very large white segmented heavily textured flower. We have used here 'Big Boy' to keep the plant size down but to introduce upright spikes of large white flowers.	
CV734/08	<i>D</i> (Coote x (Rutherford Sunspot x Aussie Quest)) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (3% bigibbum)	50mm/80mm
	The colour in the pod parent flowers is almost as good as the pod parent for CV725. Again we used <i>D speciosum</i> 'Windermere' as the pollen parent to lift the flower count but hopefully not to bleach out the colour of the resulting progeny. Should be as good as CV725.... definitely worth a dabble.	

CV735/08	D Brinawa Charm 'Eclipse' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' = D Barry Simpson HOT/COLD (12% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	<i>D speciosum</i> 'Windermere' gets another guernsey with an endeavour to again not wash out the strong maroon colour of the pod parent. Results should be medium sized plants carrying an enormous cloud of maroon flowers when grown to reasonable size.	50mm/80mm
CV740/08	D (Jayden x Rutherford Sunspot) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The pod parent is a very large (circa 80mm) flower carried well and truly above the leaves on medium spikes. Mated with the fabled 'Daylight Moon' we are looking for increased texture in long sprays of maroon coloured flowers.	80mm***
CV741/08	D (Jayden x Rutherford Sunspot) x Aussie Quest 'Samson' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The same pod parent as in CV740 but this time using a more colourful pollen parent renowned for producing quality flowers of heavy texture on upright spikes well above the foliage. Should be worth having together with the previous cross to compare the end results.	50mm/80mm
CV742/08	D (Class x Intense '#3' = D Brimbank Pink Rose) x Aussie Quest 'Samson' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	This should produce a similar result to the previous CV741 with the potential of more spikes and flowers which may be smaller in size. If you bought the previous two add this to your shopping basket as well.	50mm**/80mm**
CV743/08	D ((Class x Intense '#3' = D Brimbank Pink Rose) x Star of Gold) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	We have again added the fabled 'Daylight Moon' to a very large autumn-toned flower to try to increase both the texture of the flowers, the width of the segments and the count on the spikes. If all this works it should be really worth having.	50mm**/80mm**
CV744/08	D (Stunning x Rutherford Sunspot) x Aussie Quest 'Samson' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The combination here should produce top quality bench flowers and lots of them carried well above the foliage due to the use of Aussie Quest 'Samson'. Should make beautiful specimen plants.	50mm/80mm**
CV747/08	D Elegant Heart 'Springtime' x (Stunning x Rutherford Sunspot) HOT/COLD (15% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	This combination should produce a similar result to CV744 but these flowers have the potential to be larger and a smattering should have stronger autumn tones. Well worth a try!	50mm**/80mm**
CV748/08	D Gillieston Jazz 'Big Red' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (12% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Looking for a result similar to CV735 but we are expecting larger perhaps more colourful flowers.	50mm**/80mm**
CV749/08	D Louise's Rainbow x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Again expect a result similar to CV748 but there should be much larger flowers, wider segments and longer flower spikes.	50mm/80mm***
CV751/08	D Inquest x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #2' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The pod parent has strong upright spikes of large chunky purple edged flowers with strong purple lips producing a veritable cloud of colour. 'Dave's Moon' produces many sprays of beautifully presented exceptionally shaped flowers. Should produce clouds of colourful flowers well above the foliage when grown into a specimen plant.	50mm
CV755/08	D Intense x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The result should be similar to CV751 and the flowers could be much darker... definite bench quality.	50mm**/80mm**
CV756/08	D Warringah 'Sara' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (25% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	If this works as planned it could SOLD of the 'clouds of purple flowers above the foliage' crosses.	80mm
CV758/08	D Coote x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The pod parent here is a broad segmented medium-sized flower with red/purple segment tips over a cream centre. Looking for heavily textured broad segmented flowers retaining their colour given the use of <i>D speciosum</i> 'Windermere' as the pod parent.	50mm

CV760/08	<i>D</i> Class 'Whitehall' (AM/ANOS) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	'Whitehall' has grown into an extremely impressive specimen plant subsequent to being champion hybrid and receiving its AM. With the addition of 'Half Moon' to the gene pool there could be some large spectacular bench quality plants produced by this cross. A must for all.	50mm/80mm
CV761/08	<i>D</i> Warringah 'Sara' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon' HOT/COLD (25% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Similar to CV756 and the use of 'Half Moon' could introduce heavier texture and larger flowers than those produced by the 'Windermere' cross. Again, buy one of each to compare the result!	50mm***
CV762/08	<i>D</i> Gillieston Jazz 'Big Red' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon' HOT/COLD (12% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Same principles apply as those in the previous cross that is, similar to a cross using 'Windermere' as the pollen parent but hopefully producing the larger heavier textured flowers.	50mm**/80mm**
CV763/08	<i>D</i> Latimore 'Moreton' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	The pod parent used here displays a strong Tie-Dye influence and if that is maintained in the resulting (hopefully!) higher flowers counts of wide-segmented heavily textured flowers then this should be a must for any keen native enthusiast.	50mm**/80mm**
CV764/08	<i>D</i> Juliet's Love 'Best' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Similar result to CV749.	50mm**/80mm**
CV766/08	<i>D</i> Brinawa Sunset 'Heartlip' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Bob' HOT/COLD (12% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	A beautifully shaped, especially the lip, autumn toned flower here mated with a very robust var <i>curvicaule</i> with medium spikes of large heavily textured flowers. Should produce superb bench quality autumn toned flowers on medium spikes above strong plants. Could be different and exciting.	50mm**
CV768/08	<i>D</i> (Stunning x Lusty) 'Helga Richards' x Ray's Spot 'Phillip Fry' HOT/COLD (3% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Both plants used here display large n SOLD beautiful iridescent sparkling purple flowers. The progeny can only be clouds of iridescence, 3 purple flowers and when grown to specimen plants should all be show winners.	80mm***
CV771/08	<i>D</i> (Brinawa Charm x June Mac) x Rudkin 'Dark Purple' HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	Purple!! Purple!! Purple!! And iridescent to boot!! With a flower count like a <i>D kingianum</i> . Should be similar to the previous cross but the flowers may be smaller with more of them.	50mm***/80mm**
CV774/08	<i>D</i> Jayden 'King's Park' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Palmerston' = <i>D</i> Greta Snow HOT/COLD (6% <i>bigibbum</i>)	
	If you are looking for very large, wide segmented <i>D speciosum</i> style flowers and lots of them on medium to large plants then this is the one for you. If these turn out anything like previous plants of this cross then there will be a number of show winning plants among them.	50mm***/80mm**

	Bred for dazzling colour. Both plants have beautifully shaped flowers splashed with maroon markings on yellow backgrounds and dark red labellums. Results should be gaudy and prolific.	50mm/80mm
CV718/08	<i>D</i> Aussie Child 'Sydenham' x Jazz 'Red Lip'	
	Also bred for dazzling colour as with the previous cross but with potentially larger flowers with the injection of <i>D</i> Aussie Child. A definite if you are looking for colour.	50mm**/80mm**

CV721/08	<i>D</i> Aussie Child 'Sydenham' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Windermere' = <i>D</i> Avril's Gold [Please note higher cost for this catalogue item - \$15 (50mm)]	50mm
	This is a re-make of the much sought after classic <i>D</i> Avril's Gold but using a different clone of <i>D</i> Aussie Child than the earlier plants. First flowering from this cross produced bench quality 80mm flowers with pale red/maroon markings on the segments.	
CV722/08	<i>D</i> Cobber 'Lavender & Lime' x (<i>speciosum</i> var(<i>speciosum</i> 'Wattellow' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon')) 'Yellow Moon' = <i>D</i> Australian Artist	50mm/80mm
	This is a re-make using the same highly colourful pod parent with a different pollen parent with a view to increasing the size and texture of the flowers on the resulting progeny. If they turn out better than the earlier plants they will be visions of colour.	
CV727/08	<i>D</i> Rudkin x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'Impressive'	50mm***
	The pod parent has only small flowers but what it loses in size it makes up for in width of segments, brilliant iridescent colour and number of flowers per cane. Mated here with a beautiful type <i>D</i> <i>speciosum</i> of possibly the largest proportions that I have seen in flowers, length of spike and plant structure. If it all works as expected the result should nothing short of spectacular.	
CV729/08	<i>D</i> Rudkin x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Dave's Moon #2'	50mm***/80mm***
	Should produce similar results to that of the previous cross. Should be worth buying some of each to see which is the best.	
CV736/08	<i>D</i> <i>speciosum</i> var <i>grandiflorum</i> 'Jelita' x 'Rhonda's Gold'	50mm/80mm
	Both of these parents are outstanding examples of this variety and if the result is better than either parent then it will be exceptional. But be prepared to set lots of space aside and a block of time.	
CV738/08	<i>D</i> <i>speciosum</i> var (<i>speciosum</i> 'National White' x <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon')	50mm/80mm
	We flowered this cross some years ago which has won champions both in Queensland and NSW and were determined to re-make it when the parents became available. Here it is! A must for the <i>D</i> <i>speciosum</i> enthusiast.	
CV739/08	<i>D</i> (Yondi x Graeme Banks) x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon'	50mm/80mm***
	The pod parent is a medium sized buttercup yellow flower with wide segments. With the addition of the moon we are looking for an increased flower count of larger flowers with the same colouration but more evenly spaced with perfect presentation.	
CV745/08	<i>D</i> Zip 'J McM' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'National White' = <i>D</i> Lisa Turner	50mm/80mm
	<i>D</i> Zip in its own right is a beautiful specimen plant with crowds of colourful flowers. Hopefully 'National White' will add strength to spikes so that the flowers will be well above the foliage but increased size, texture and count without losing the colour.	
CV746/08	<i>D</i> <i>speciosum</i> var <i>speciosum</i> 'National White' x 'Stewart'	50mm/80mm
	Both of these parents are renowned for clear white flowers and the pod parent with bolt upright spikes and the pollen parent with large heavily textured wide segmented flowers. If we combine these attributes the resulting plants should be show winners.	
CV759/08	<i>D</i> Ray's Spot 'Phillip Fry' x <i>speciosum</i> var <i>curvicaule</i> 'Half Moon'	50mm
	'Phillip Fry' has iridescent flowers with purple edging and a bold purple lip held well above the foliage on upright spikes and lots of them. 'Half Moon' shows the good attributes in texture presentation and flower count from its 'Daylight Moon' breeding and should make a perfect union to produce exceptional progeny.	
CV767/08	<i>D</i> (Candice x Lusty) 'Valentine' x Ray's Spot 'Phillip Fry'	80mm***
	If ever any cross produced crowds of brilliant SOLD flowers hovering over medium sized plants then this surely must be it.	
CV769/08	<i>D</i> Ray's Spot 'River City' x (Rutherford Sunspot x Aussie Quest)	80mm***
	It is difficult to tell 'River City' and 'Phillip Fry' SOLD both are class winners. The pollen parent used here includes another dose of Rutherford Sunspot which should intensify the purple colouring with the spike strength coming from the Aussie Quest injection. Could be on a par with CV767.	

CV772/08	<i>D. speciosum</i> var <i>grandiflorum</i> ('Beranghi Gold' x self) x 'Jelita'	Again two very good var <i>grandiflorum</i> s combined which should produce some outstanding results. Buying more than one will increase your chances of getting that outstanding one.	50mm***/80mm***
